Topics include agriculture and forests, urbanization, energy use, biodiversity loss, and environmental governance from antiquity to the present.

By combining historical sources with ecological and interdisciplinary methods, the workshop aims to deepen understanding of Europe's environmental trajectories and to inform contemporary debates on the evolution of institutions within ecological transitions.
